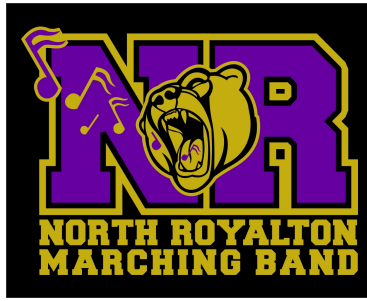

North Royalton High School Band Chaperone Interest Form

April 2-April 7, 2018

Thank you for your interest in chaperoning the North Royalton High School Marching Band spring break 2018 trip to Orlando, Florida. It is because of committed, dedicated parents and boosters like you volunteering to be chaperones, that we are able to take trips such as this. This is a fun experience, and chaperones who have traveled with the band in the past felt it was exciting to have the opportunity to travel with this enthusiastic group of students! By submitting this form, this signifies you understand the roles, responsibilities, and expectations of chaperones for this trip. There will be a detailed "Chaperone Meeting" before we depart where I will meet with all chaperones and go over specifics, but below are outlined general expectations set by the NRHS Administration and Band Staff for trips:

Chaperone Roles, Responsibilities, & Expectations:

- No one under the age of 22 may chaperone a Band Trip
- Chaperones must be able to commit to being with the band from the time we load at NRHS on Monday April 2 in the early morning, all the way until we are done unloading back at NRHS on Saturday April 7
- Chaperones will not be able to join the trip late, leave early, or deviate from the trip itinerary, we need chaperones to be able to commit to the trip in it's entirety
- Chaperones must be physically able to assist with loading and unloading of luggage
- Chaperones must be able to ride the bus with the students the entire trip, as monitoring the bus is an important part of being a chaperone
- Chaperones, as an adult role model for this school function, must abstain from the use of cigarettes, nicotine, and alcohol during the course of the trip
- Chaperones are responsible for keeping the rooms that they are assigned informed of all details of the trip. There will be nightly chaperone meetings, outlining information that needs to be relayed to your particular rooms. We count on the chaperones to make sure your rooms are monitored and informed of details
- Chaperones will help with assist with situations as they arise, as directed by Mr. Vitale – including checking in at First-Aid centers at the theme parks, helping students that might need medical attention, etc.
- Chaperones may additionally be asked to help with other tasks including (but not limited to): monitoring halls, night duty, room inspection, luggage inspection, luggage loading and unloading, etc.
- It is the chaperone's responsibility to pay for their trip on time following the trip payment guidelines
- Every chaperone will be rooming with one other adult, and each chaperone will have their own bed when we arrive at the hotel
- **Chaperones understand there is one set of rules for every person on the trip, and chaperones understand that they need to follow protocol and procedures for the trip, as outlined by Mr. Vitale at the Chaperone Meeting. We need every chaperone on the same page when it comes to these expectations.**
